

Halloween 2020

CDC Guidance

Many traditional Halloween activities can be high-risk for spreading viruses. There are several safer, alternative ways to participate in Halloween. If you may have COVID-19 or you may have been exposed to someone with COVID-19, you should not participate in in-person Halloween festivities and should not give out candy to trick-or-treaters.



Halloween in Easton

Town of Easton will continue the traditional Halloween activity of Trick-or-Treating for 2020 while encouraging residents to stay within their home communities and developments and use the following additional safe practices during the evening:

- Wear a face mask covering your mouth and nose, Halloween themed cloth masks, made of two or more layers of breathable fabric and that do not leave gaps around your face should be consider for use.
 - Do not use a costume mask that does not meet the description above
 - Do not wear a costume mask over a cloth mask, this can be dangerous and makes breathing difficult
- Hand sanitize frequently during the evening
- Trick or Treat with people you live with
- Parents should accompany children
- Remain 6 feet apart from people not in your household
- Provide and Participate in one-way trick-or-treating
- Position a distribution table between yourself and trick-or-treaters
- Do not crowd together at the distribution tables
- Distribute candy on disinfected surface to eliminate direct contact
- Individually wrapped candy or goodie bags should be lined up for trick-or-treaters to grab and go, without touching those for others
- Wash your hands prior to preparing goodie bags and placing them or individually wrapped candy for distribution
- Sick and or quarantined individuals should remain home and not hand out candy

As an additional reminder porch lights on, are the traditional indicator of participating in the Halloween tradition of trick-or-treating, those residents with porch lights off are opting out this 2020 year.

Halloween information for residents!



The Commissioners of St. Michaels have not cancelled Halloween, but strongly encourage parents to find creative alternatives to door-to-door trick or treating.

Even though trick-or-treating will be allowed Saturday night October 31st from 6 to 8 p.m. for children ages 12 and under, Halloween in St. Michaels will not be the same. The little ghouls and goblins who normally fill town don't frighten us as much as the coronavirus. Many residents are choosing to opt out this year and their porch lights will remain dark.

HALLOWEEN INFORMATION

On October 7, 2020, the Council decided not to prohibit nor to promote trick-or-treating in the Town of Trappe. Residents may decide if they would like to participate in trick-or-treating from 6-8 pm on October 31st. Those who choose to participate are strongly encouraged to adhere to the following safety guidelines:

- 🎃 Wear a facemask covering your nose and mouth
- 🎃 Practice social distancing – only travel with members of your household and remain six feet apart from others
- 🎃 Sanitize your hands frequently
- 🎃 Candy should be individually wrapped or placed in goodie bags – remember to wash your hands prior to preparing the candy
- 🎃 Sick or quarantined individuals should remain home and not participate in handing out candy

Please be respectful of those who choose not to participate. Those who wish to opt out of this year's Halloween festivities may leave their porch lights off as a signal to trick-or-treaters.
